# President's report



2020 marked the end of an extraordinary decade for the club, securing our ninth Club Championship in 10 years and winning back to back 1st Grade Premierships for the first time.

The season's end also saw the COVID-19 global pandemic

arrive. Interestingly and fortuitously for cricket, it has exposed Cricket Australia's deep administrative and financial issues, creating a long overdue catalyst for change.

Once again, our success was anchored by the club's culture. Success for any sporting organisation is challenging, continued success is quite extraordinary. Each year, new players continue to pay respect to past generations while continuing to shape the club through their own values. Respect for the past while owning the future enables us to continually improve, compete, outperform and overcome new challenges.

I think the other key philosophy that underpins our success is that, strategically and administratively, we never lose sight of our purpose. This is something many major sporting bodies have struggled with in recent times. We are a not-for-profit, and fundamentally exist to provide opportunities for people to play cricket at the highest level they can. A clear and simple purpose enables us to prioritise what is important, like increasing participation, building facilities, providing excellent coaching, developing future leaders and above all, enjoying the game we love.

## Men's cricket

1st Grade were front runners all year, which led to a deserved Premiership when the Grand Final was cancelled due to the pandemic. Dugie Hill's 2nd Grade and Lachy Guilfoyle's 5th Grade one day side also delivered premierships, while our 3rd and 4th Grade sides made finals.

We are incredibly lucky currently to have a perfect blend of experience and youth, with guys like Scott Henry, Michael Philipson, Mitchell Fry and Scott Walter continuing to mentor an exciting new generation. We look forward to seeing the names of Willans, Clayton, Walker and Sanders and go up in lights in the future!

My thanks to Club Captain Scott Henry, Hamish Gardener and Pete Clarke once again for providing the structure and leadership to enable our success this year.

Thanks also to Lance Morgan for leading the most challenging team to select each week, and to Arnie Saha leading 3s to finals and Oliver Mower delivering another minor premiership. I also can't go past Jono McTaggett, who stepped up in a big way as 5s captain and at training. I enjoyed my one game of the year in his 5s side, despite being made to bowl and watching him hilariously run himself out in the 90s.

## Women's cricket

2020 marked a significant turnaround for our Women's Club thanks largely to the efforts of coach Mark Daldy, Matthew Miller, Bronwyn Atkinson and Shelley Mabsout. Laura Harris must also be commended for some brutal batting, which took us the T20 Grand Final and within sight of Premiership before we fell tantalising short against a star-studded Wests side. Our player depth also increased significantly thanks to several very talented girls joining the club, which bodes well for the future.

## Junior cricket

Junior programs are increasingly important within Premier clubs. This year, we saw an almost 30 per cent increase in junior participation and over 25 per cent increase within our Blues Academy sessions. We introduced our new Stage 1 and Stage 2 girls sides, which will ensure the future of our women's programs remain strong.

Our focus now is on a major skills development drive to ensure we create our next generation of stars. As such, we have expanded our school holiday programs, which are proving very popular, and next year will look to significantly increase our pre-season coaching and specialised skills sessions.

A special mention to all our Junior coaches in what is always a challenging role. It was great to see so many past players back coaching such as Paul Mackintosh, Graydon Atthow, Ashley Brandon and Chris Hall.

Firstly, thanks to Mike Jennings, Scott Henry, Elliot Ryan and Andrew Courtice for another successful Test Breakfast (No. 18!), with Jason Gillespie an entertaining and obliging guest.

Scott Henry once again was instrumental in ensuring our success on and off the field, overseeing our daily operations, delivering new sponsors and ensuring our new player programs were successful. Several clubs have now followed our lead and introduced Operations Managers, which is an exciting move for cricket in Queensland.

Hamish Gardener did a wonderful job as Director of Cricket, providing additional structure to our junior programs. Club Administrator Shelley Mabsout combined a full-time job, motherhood and pregnancy with the thankless tasks of club administration, managing registrations and overseeing our policies and compliance.

Once again, thanks to the Executive Committee — Bill Tuffley, Brendan Logue, Bronwyn Atkinson, Mick Watter, Matt Adams, Elliot Ryan and Michelle Mabsout — for their assistance, and to UQ P&F, particularly Jimmy and Dean, for delivering great wickets each week.

Thanks also to our major sponsors, FDC Construction, Engineers GHD and La Porchetta.

### Awards

The major awards were once again the highlight of our end of season dinner. It was a pleasure to have Michael Kasproicz attend to present Scott Walter with his third WEP Harris Medal. The Tom Corcoran Award presented by the wonderful Sheila Corcoran, and representing someone that best embodied

club culture, has now become as big as the WEP Harris Medal, and was won by the ever popular Jano Coetzee. Michael Miller won the EJD Stanley Award for his service to the club, driving our social side and being assistant coach within the women's program, while Kate Beaumont was voted Women's Player of the Year.

### Administration

Administratively, the club delivered on a three-year plan to have our Operations Manager role fully embedded and funded with a return to surplus. This marked a significant if not particularly exciting achievement, requiring years of reform and focus across all areas of revenue and expenditure. While clubs remain dependent on volunteers, dedicated administrative resources within clubs are becoming critical to ensure their sustainability.

Financially, the club remains in a strong position with retained profits of \$439,929 and the Foundation Trust retaining \$219,552. Annual revenue was \$504,186, with annual expenditure of \$431,345. Our net operation profit exceeded our budgeted position with a surplus of \$83,544.

## **Geoffrey James Maule (No 289)**

Born: 7 April 1924 at Redcliffe

Died: 10 December 2019 at Brisbane

Known as 'Tom', he was educated at Marist Brothers College, Rosalie, and played mainly in Second Grade in seasons 1949–50 and 1950–51, before temporarily retiring from cricket. During this period, he made appearances in First Grade, once in each of those seasons, as a right-hand batsman and right arm medium fast bowler. He graduated BCom in 1954.

By 1955, the then Lord Mayor Clem Jones was starting to build an impregnable fortress in 4th grade and needed a decent opening bowler; he managed to demand or cajole Tom (older members of the club know what this means!) into returning to grade cricket, this time in 4th grade. He rewarded his captain by taking 57 wickets in 1955–56 (1st in QCA), 79 wickets in 1956–57 (again 1st in QCA) and 66 wickets in 1957–58. With just one more wicket in the following season (in which he retired with an ankle injury), he had taken a remarkable 213 wickets in a fraction over three seasons! Counting his earlier results, Tom took in all 233 wickets and scored just under 800 runs (including one century) for the club.

In World War II, Tom served in the Royal Australian Navy in the Arafura Sea, Indian and Pacific oceans, and also with the British Pacific Fleet.

Tom made a failed attempt at a political career for the QLP (forerunner of the Democrats) — with Clem (ALP) and John Moore (ex Liberal Cabinet Minister) in the same side on occasions, it is not recorded whether on field political arguments took place!

## **Stanley Michael McDonnell (No 345)**

Born: 23 February 1936 at St George

Died: 26 December 2019 at Sunshine Coast

Known as 'Shooter', a nickname which he claimed was allegedly acquired on the rifle range at his school CEGS (now ACGS), Mike McDonnell was a right-hand batsman, a schoolboy wicketkeeper, and

in his early days at the club, a medium fast bowler. His early period involved a desire to bowl as fast as possible, and this gave him reasonable success in mainly Second and Third Grade for at least four seasons from 1953–54. Thereafter he discovered that by slowing his pace, he achieved swing, sometimes both ways. His medium paced deliveries propelled him into First Grade in seasons 1958–59 to 1960–61. He continued playing intermittently when professional duties allowed, and thereafter appeared in Old Boys matches and in touring sides. In all grades, he took 192 wickets, including 48 at 19.6 in First Grade; with the bat he scored 752 runs in all grades, including 109 in First Grade at 9.9.

He obtained an MBBS in 1960, the Fellowship of the Royal College of Medicine from London in 1983, and was Foundation Fellow of the Australian Society of Rural and Remote Medicine in 1997. His father was the GP at St George from 1920 to approximately 1955, and was also Chairman of the Balonne Shire.

Michael practised at St George from 1965, then moved to Toowoomba in 1983, finally retiring to the Sunshine Coast in 2006.

As a matter of interest, he was the grandson of Percy Stanislaus McDonnell, who played cricket for Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland, and who captained Australia's Test Team from 1886 to 1888.

## **Keith Samuel Jennings**

Born: 7 December 1941 at Dalby

Died: 19 January 2020 at Brisbane



Known as 'Punchy', a nickname probably acquired from his days as a First Grade rugby player for University and for Queensland, Keith was educated at BGS and joined our club in season 1970–71. He then played for 14 seasons straight, returning for four more seasons until 1989–90 as he was nearing 50 years of age. Always supremely fit, he bowled medium paced cutters and batted left hand. He played mainly in Third Grade, although he did have appearances in Second Grade. Keith holds the club record for most wickets taken in Third Grade — 358, with a total of 413 when Second Grade wickets are included. He scored a total of 1189 runs in both grades.

Keith was the quintessential club man, serving as President and on committees both formal and informal, and figuring largely in the affairs of the Old Boys as an organiser and player in local, Golden Oldies and Masters competitions. The club has Keith to thank for the original idea and subsequent organisation of the Test Breakfast, which he ran successfully for many years until handing it over to his son Michael, who maintains the same high standard.

Keith obtained a Bachelor of Science in Forestry in 1966, and went on to study at Yale School of Forestry in the USA, graduating in 1970 as a Master of Forestry. His working life was with the Queensland Department of Forestry, the DPI and the EPA. He retired in 2003. Keith's continued service to the club was recognised by the awarding of life membership in 2009.



**George Corones (No 198)**

Born: 6 April 1918 at Charleville

Died: 22 March 2020 at Brisbane

Dr George Corones was born into the well-known Corones family of western Queensland, the owners of hotels in Charleville and Quilpie. He was educated as a boarder at Toowoomba Grammar School and, as a left-hand batsman, medium paced bowler and occasional wicketkeeper, he played First and Second Grade in seasons 1937–38, 1938–39 and 1939–40. In 12 First Grade fixtures, he scored 145 runs at 9.7 average. In a career cut short by medical studies and distance from home, he also played in the intervarsity match against Sydney University in 1938, regarded in those days as one of the most important fixtures of the first grade season.

He obtained the MBBS in 1944 and then served in the RAAF for the remainder of World War II. He practised as a GP in western Queensland and then in Brisbane. As a very fit man in his 80s and then 90s, he competed in, and won, swimming races in the Veteran Masters. At only a fortnight short of his 102nd birthday, George was, prior to his death, the oldest surviving member of our club, and the last of those who played prior to the war.

### **Trevor George Stewart (No 347)**

Born: 15 March 1940 at Mt Isa

Died: 10 May 2020 at Brisbane

Trevor Stewart was educated at various country schools in Queensland, finishing at Downlands College in Toowoomba. His career for our club commenced in season 1959–60 and continued unbroken in First Grade until his last season in 1965–66, a total of 75 matches. In that time he took 176 wickets at 15.3 and scored 507 runs at 12.4. He made his First Class debut for Queensland in February 1961 v Victoria in Brisbane. His six First Class appearances for Queensland produced 120 runs with a highest score of 36, while taking 13 wickets at 44.92, the best being 3/78. He represented Queensland Colts in the Sydney Gregory Cup against New South Wales in seasons 1958–59, 1959–60 and 1960–61.

He was a primary school teacher working in schools throughout Queensland, reaching the position of school principal in 1968, and retaining that position until his retirement in 1995. After his retirement from First Grade cricket, he finished his career by answering the siren call of Clem Jones to play in Clem's Fourth Grade side for a short period. In retirement he became disabled, and distinguished himself by his support for disabled young cricketers.

### **POSTSCRIPT**

The death of George Corones gives rise to speculation as to the Uni player who is now the oldest surviving player in any grade, not necessarily a first grader. While I am reasonably sure that I am abreast of the old first graders, there are many lower graders that I have lost track of. If anyone can provide me with the name of a candidate for this, please contact me. So far, I know that Life Member Peter Catsoulis (born 13/11/1921), Dr Jim Steel (born 21/6/1927), Life Member Ken Archer (born 17/1/1928) and Ian Harris (born 24/5/1929) are all in contention, either now or in the future. Ken Archer is also the oldest surviving Australian Test player.

# Director of Cricket report



2019–20 was yet another notable season, with the Blues runaway winners in the Club Championship for a record nine out of 10 seasons, rounding off a decade of dominance. Pivotal to this result were the consistent

performances of the top two grades of both the men's and women's teams.

Although we contested 12 finals this season, we only took away trophies on four occasions, something to rectify next year. A special mention must go to 5(2)s for an amazing one-day final victory at WEP. The Blues supporters were sensational, and a great day was had by all.

On an individual note, our representative players and coaches once again did the club proud, with Jess Jonassen and Peter Clarke instrumental in the Australian Women's successful T20 World Cup campaign. # Third Grade report

Third Grade enjoyed a reasonably successful year in the 19–20 season, finishing the season with a close loss against Valleys in the Semi Finals. The 16 run loss in what turned out to be the final game of the season was painful stomach, but an understandable outcome after the up and down nature of the team's season. The team showed incredible perseverance and grit throughout the two days, but fell short of delivering the knock-out punch. First and Second Grade continued to set an incredible standard of performance for the club, and while Third Grade fell short in some respects, there were still some incredible performances throughout and a strong suggestion that the depth below First and Second Grade is still as strong as ever.

Pre-Christmas, the side struggled for consistency, particularly in the one day format, as the team underwent significant change from the previous year. The team was much younger than it had been in years, reflecting the generational shift occurring throughout the club. However, many of the young players turned out some great performances throughout, and despite the losses, there was a sense that the team was about to turn a corner.

Each of the close losses were followed by convincing two day victories, reflecting the inconsistency that often comes with younger players. The team bonded fantastically well throughout the ups and downs of the pre-Christmas season, and it was clear that a strong core of players were beginning to find consistency, which ultimately helped drive a significant upturn in performance. Experienced players such as J Wigginton, M Daldy and N Meadows bolstered the middle order by the end of the pre-Christmas season, batting around a rampant and aggressive

C Roberts. Youngsters H Blunn, J Hurst and M Gouveia all showed signs of promise, with critical performances at various points throughout the season. The bowling attack was firing on all cylinders, led by the indefatigable club veteran, L Miles. As injuries ravaged the club towards the end of the pre-Christmas season, the bowling attack took on a very different look, but G Mendis and H D'Addona stepped up seamlessly from their domination of Fourth Grade and rounded out a very effective attack, another great indication of the depth at the club.

Post-Christmas, the equation was clear, despite being all but knocked out of the 1D competition already, we needed to win at least 3 out of the 4 remaining two day games to make the semi final. The boys stepped up and played our best cricket for a long time, winning all games played during this period (excluding the wash out). The dominance of the post-Christmas season made the semi-final loss an extremely bitter pill to swallow, but we only had ourselves to blame after the slow start to the season.

Looking ahead to the new year, there are plenty of outstanding young players to watch who are lucky to be learning and playing the game with the host of outstanding and experienced cricketers still playing at the club. There is a strong feeling around the group that the players will be building upon the foundations set in the previous year to go on to achieve something special.

# Women's coach report

I took on the role of head coach at UQCC hopeful, but unsure of what we were capable of achieving. I didn't know much about the players and I only had reputations and stats to try and understand why our women's teams had only won five of 38 games between them in the previous year, despite having the services of state players Haidee Birkett and Laura Harris in the team at various times. It soon became apparent that, while the girls loved playing for the club and friendships were paramount in the squad, there was a need to improve the culture, professionalism, skill and belief in the squad.

From day one of preseason, we grew and bonded as a group. New recruits were welcomed, young players integrated and some older players returned. We had a new coaching panel with fresh ideas, and a crop of new junior players we hope will be the next generation of UQ senior players.

By the time we reached round 1 of the season, there was a belief within the group and the coaches that we would be unified, competitive and, most importantly, have depth to select from. Not only making for a competitive First Grade, but being strong in 2s as well. Blooding new younger girls into Grade cricket was important for our goal of entering an U15 Paul Pink team for the first time too.

Our season results were more than satisfactory, with 22 victories and 6 draws out of 42 games, culminating in our First Grade making the T20

Grand Final (runners up) and our Second Grade making the One Day finals for the first time in the club's history, before unfortunately losing the Semi Final. A culture of club and team mates first, some hard training and commitment were the ingredients we needed to take our club forward in women's cricket, and based on what we achieved this season, our future looks bright. Bring on 20–21!

# Lord's Taverners report

The 2019 season for Lord Taverners team was certainly one of mixed fortunes, where the team at times showed the outstanding cricket it was capable of, but was unable to sustain for long enough periods at key times. This saw the team finish the season with 3 wins for its 10 matches.

Injuries also played a key role in the side's 2019 campaign, with the loss of key all-rounder Robbie Sanders and opening batsman Sam Ireland for most of the season, having a big impact on the team's ability to push for a semi-final berth.

The season started on bright note, with an opening round 10-run win over Wide Bay at WEP Harris Oval. The fast bowling trifecta of Sanders (3/32), Owen Griffin (1/25) and Oscka Sargood (2/20) were crucial to the team's win. Unfortunately, from there the side went on a 5-game losing run, where the team's inconsistencies during matches proving to be crucial at times.

The toughest loss during that period was the round 3 loss to Western Suburbs, a game that went down to the very last ball. The Uni boys, defending a total of 163, fought tooth and nail to take the game so deep. However, a single off the last ball saw Western Suburbs come away with a 2-wicket win. Most members of the squad felt that, had the result been different that day, the season could have panned out very differently.

The team returned to the winners list in Round 7 in another thrilling contest, this time coming out on the right side of victory against Ipswich-Logan. Having posted a score of 202, the team's best score of the season to that stage, the side was facing its sixth straight loss when the Hornets entered the final 10 overs needing just 30 runs with 6 wickets in hand. However, the Uni boys produced an

outstanding display with the ball and in the field at the death, taking the last 6 wickets for just 22 runs to come away with a 6-run win. Shannen Gerard-Solker (48), Griffin (3/25) and debutant Mark Moran (3/38) played key roles in that win.

A heavy defeat to eventual runners up Redlands in round 8 was followed up by the team's best performance of the season, a 41-run win over Valley, a team that qualified for the semi-finals. A century stand between Zac Boyne (59) and Robert Kelly (51) helped anchored the team's impressive total of 7/230, with another great death bowling display, where the team took the last 6 wickets for 41 runs to dismiss Valley for 189. Griffin also had a standout game, scoring 44 and taking 3/32.

The season finished with a home game against South Brisbane, and after looking set for victory at 3/100 chasing 169, the team's inconsistency again came back to hurt it, as they fell 9 runs short in the run chase.

Despite only being able to get the 3 wins for the season, the enjoyment and culture within the team was outstanding, even when the results were not going their way. There is definitely some great talent within the ranks to help drive the club to future sustained success.

It was a pleasure coaching this group of young men in 2019, and with several boys eligible for the team again in 2020, I look forward to seeing the team push for huge success next season.

- To foster, promote, increase participation rates and develop the game of cricket within the University of Queensland and the surrounding precincts.

**Significant changes**

No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

**Contingent Asset**

The University of Queensland Cricket Club Foundation Trust (the "Trust") was established in 1998 for the purpose of providing money, property and benefits to further the sport of cricket at the University of Queensland.

The current trust value is \$219,552.38 (2019: \$218,579.73).

**Operating result**

The profit of the University of Queensland Cricket Club for the financial year after providing for income tax amounted to \$ 83,544(2019: \$ (76,103)).

**Related party transactions**

No committee member has received or become entitled to receive, during or since the end of financial year, a benefit because of a contract made by the incorporated association or a related body corporate with the committee member, a firm of which a committee member is a member or an entity in which a committee member has a substantial financial interest.

**1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity on the basis that, in the opinion of the committee, there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy, specifically, all of their information needs. Accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose financial report, which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Qld) 1981.

The financial report covers University of Queensland Cricket Club Inc. as an individual entity. University of Queensland Cricket Club Inc. is a association, formed and domiciled in Australia. University of Queensland Cricket Club Inc. is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements.

**Basis of Preparation**

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by revaluations to fair value for certain classes of assets and liabilities as described in accounting policies.

**(a) Financial instruments**

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the University of Queensland Cricket Club becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

**(b) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

**(c) Revenue and other income**

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the University of Queensland Cricket Club and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the University of Queensland Cricket Club obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the University of Queensland Cricket Club incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

**(c) Revenue and other income (continued)**

University of Queensland Cricket Club receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

**(d) Goods and services tax (GST)**

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

**(e) Comparative figures**

Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified and repositioned for consistency with current year disclosures.

**(f) Income Tax**

The University of Queensland Cricket Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.



## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

#### QUALIFIED OPINION

We have audited the financial report of University of Queensland Cricket Club Inc. ("the Association"), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2020, the income statement for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and the statement by the members of the Committee.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at 30 June 2020, and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the *Association Incorporations Act 1981*.

#### BASIS FOR QUALIFIED OPINION

Members Subscriptions, Function Revenue, Canteen Revenue, Merchandise Sales and Coaching Income are mainly cash transactions. The Association has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of these cash transactions prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding these revenue sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to these transactions had to be restricted to those amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether the revenue transactions recorded in the income statement by the Association are complete.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of *Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.



## **EMPHASIS OF MATTER – BASIS OF ACCOUNTING**

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Association to meet the requirements of the *Association Incorporations Act 1981*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
