President's report



Reflecting on the 2023–24 season, it is evident that our cricket club has continued to embody the spirit and resilience that define our community. This year was marked by representative achievements on the field and the unwavering

commitment of our players, volunteers and supporters for all the countless hours and discretionary effort that is so critical to running our club.

Men's cricket

First Grade

Expectations were high starting the season in August with the T20 Max competition. Our First Grade men faced immediate challenges due to serious injuries to key bowlers, which set them back for much of the year.

Our senior bowlers stood up, with the ever consistent Matt Willans and Callum Henderson continuing to impress – old boys were there to witness one of Hendo's pace and skill attacks under lights at AB Oval. Injuries gave home-grown talent Hayden D'Adonna and Brayden Meegama more of an opportunity, from which they took a mix of learnings and success.

Our batters, who were so dominant last season, offered moments of brilliance in all forms, but failed to replicate the remarkable consistency and sheer volume of runs from last season. Pleasingly, Lovell, Street and Jack Clayton appear nicely positioned as Queensland's top 3 in the Sheffield Shield.

The team's character was truly tested. Bryce Street's commanding 140 and Alec Day's maiden century set the tone early, yet the season was marked by narrow losses in closely contested matches. These experiences, though hard-fought, will be invaluable as the team looks ahead to 2024–25.

Second Grade

Reflecting on Second Grade's rollercoaster of a season – which started with a promising victory followed by a couple of hard-fought losses – will prove important experience as our youngest

Second Grade side for nearly two decades takes the field in 2024–25.

With bat in hand, the future looks bright for Akshat Mishra, whose elegance came with a good measure of determination, while Edson Whattam turned talent into match winning runs in the short form. A close semi-final loss in the 50 over format will, I hope, prove motivation for those going around again.

In the two-day format, consistency proved elusive, leading to a mid-table finish. However, individual performances, such as Kelaart's 557 runs and D'Adonna's 28 wickets, were vital contributions.

Though the season didn't deliver all the desired silverware, the often talked about 'good vibes' were the envy of the competition, and may prove the glue that keeps this group turning up for each other in the heat of the battle they will face in the seasons ahead.

Third Grade

The Third Grade season was defined by grit and resilience, led by the experienced Michael Philipson in his swan song year. Despite the challenges, the team fought their way to a respectable 3rd place in the two-day regular season, with standout individual performances that lit up the campaign. Chang's 394 runs not only led the team, but earned him the WEP Harris Medal, a fitting recognition of his contribution.

While the team's finals run in the two-day competition ended in a semi-final loss, and washouts marred the one-day campaign, the season was far from a disappointment. The team's effort, with seven players earning Second Grade debuts, laid a strong foundation for future success. The moments of brilliance and the hard-fought battles have set the stage for what's to come.

Fourth Grade

In a now familiar theme, our Fourth Grade Men's season began with promise, as the team stormed through the early matches, winning the first four games. The highlight was a thrilling victory against Wests, featuring standout centuries from Sam Chew and Will Finch.

However, as the season wore on, the team faced challenges with availability and weather, leading to inconsistent performances. Despite these hurdles, the team's spirit remained unbroken, with

memorable performances from players like Lincoln Rosiak and wicketkeeper Alex Walduck.

As the team bids farewell to club legends like Sam Chew and Stephen Carpenter, there's a sense of both nostalgia and anticipation. The experiences of this season, though mixed, will serve as a stepping stone for a stronger campaign next year.

Fifth Grade

The season proved to be a test of resilience for the 5th Grade (2) side. Despite the best efforts and commitment from the team, results fell short of expectations. The inconsistency of performance, particularly in batting and fielding, highlighted areas for improvement for the season ahead.

Moments of individual brilliance included performances from George Thomas, Abhimanyu Chutani and Bailey Gould, whose contribution kept the 'uni' competitive spirit alive.

While the season may not have met the team's aspirations, it served as a crucial learning experience, laying the foundation for future success. The support and mentorship from the club's veterans were invaluable, ensuring that even in a challenging season, the team continued to grow and develop.

Sixth Grade

The season was a testament to the enduring camaraderie and passion that defines cricket at all levels. Under the leadership of Chris Forrester, affectionately known as "Old Man Forrey", the team navigated a season of near-misses and hard-fought battles.

The season's narrative was one of what could have been, with the team narrowly missing out on finals due to circumstances beyond their control. Despite the setbacks, the team showed remarkable improvement, particularly in their cohesion and focus.

Contributions from players like Isaac Vitelli, Shushant, and promising young wicketkeepers Conor Foxlee and Cormac Todd, were standout moments. The team's bowling unit, bolstered by the likes of Vish Kumar and Mitch Taylor, remained a strength throughout the season.

As Forrey steps down, his reflection on the season – and his time with the club – is one of fond memories and deep appreciation for the friendships and

experiences cricket has brought him. The season, while not crowned with a championship, was rich in spirit and marked by a collective effort that bodes well for the future.

My thanks go to those who captained – Jack Clayton, Angus Lovell, Chris Peirson, Elliot Beath, Jonathan McTaggart, Lachlan Guilfoyle, Declan Sparks and Chris Forrester for managing their sides through a long hard season!

Women's cricket

The First Grade Women's team won back-to-back T20 Premierships, once again proving their capability and resilience in a thrilling series of matches that exemplified their fighting spirit.

Rising from sixth place on the ladder with just two games remaining, the girls from the varsity defied the odds to face top-seeded Wests in a semi-final that will be remembered for years to come. The team's bowling attack, led by Bree Craven and Jess Daldy, demonstrated clinical precision, while Tara Wheeler's composed 49 runs were instrumental in clinching the victory with just three balls to spare.

The grand final the following day against Sunny Coast was the crown jewel of the season. Faced with a challenging target of 143, the Uni girls rallied with a heroic performance, capped by Ava Spencer's match-winning 35* that sealed their triumph in the last over. This victory was more than just a win – it was a testament to their determination and ability to rise to the occasion when it mattered most.

The one-day season, though ending with a heart-wrenching loss in the Grand Final against Valley, was no less remarkable. The addition of Tara Norris, whose on-field performances and off-field presence brought new energy to the team, along with consistent contributions from the likes of Tara Wheeler, Emma Jackson and Anlo Van Deventer, ensured that the team remained a dominant force throughout the competition.

As the season concludes, we bid farewell to coach Mark Daldy, whose five years of dedication have been pivotal in shaping the female program at UQ. His legacy will undoubtedly continue to inspire future generations.

Looking ahead to the 2024–25 season, there is a palpable sense of optimism and determination among the player group, who continue their efforts to improve and deliver silverware!

ROBERT WILLIAM MIHELL (No 330)

Born 8 January 1937 at Lismore
Died 5 February 2024 at Brisbane

Bob Mihell was a right hand batsman and an occasional leg break bowler. He was educated at

Kyogle State High School and later at the University of Queensland, where he graduated Bachelor of Engineering (Electrical) Hons in 1958 and Bachelor of Commerce in 1974. Bob represented Queensland Colts in the Sydney Gregory Cup match of 1957–8. Bob played in the UQCC Firsts from 1955 till 1966, with a break in 1961 for study overseas. He scored 4333 club First Grade runs at 39.8, while bowling he took 6 wickets at 48.5. His career for our club included 11 centuries. Our club owes a lot to Bob, who captained the Firsts for 9 seasons, bringing a tenacity and flair that resulted in the winning of two premierships in contrast to the previous 43 years, during which only one was won. Bob appeared for Queensland in 11 First Class matches from 1955–6 to 1960–1, scoring 281 runs at 15.61, with his highest score 45. In 1958–9, he was a member of the combined Australian Universities team to play the first international match against New Zealand Universities, rained out in Melbourne; he later captained the Australian Universities team in Canberra against the West Indies team of 1960–1, a match in which he scored 116. At the end of his career for Queensland University, Bob moved to Melbourne where he continued with First Grade club appearances, first with the Melbourne Club, and lastly with Hawthorne-East Melbourne. Bob worked as an electrical engineer and coal marketing manager for Mt Isa Mines Ltd. In Bob's retirement, he and John Biggs prepared and digitised the club's First Grade stats for its century from 1912 to 2012. For his services to the club, he was appointed a Life Member in 2008.

TREVOR RONALD CORY (No 320)

Born 5 August 1934 at Brisbane
Died 30 July 2023 at Brisbane

Trevor Cory was a right hand batsman and right hand medium fast bowler. He was the son of University cricketer Francis James Cory (No 42), who played in the 1918 team. He played in the CEGS First XI and shared the fast bowling duties at school in 1950 and 1951 with Ron Archer (later Souths, Queensland and Australia) and Harry Chapman (later Sandgate-Redcliffe). His windmill inswing bowling style was disconcerting for most schoolboy batsmen, and more than a few club men as well. After school, he played for Easts in 1952–4 and again in 1960–1, and later for Balmoral-Wynnum in 1962–3. He played for University from 1954–5 until 1958–9, forming a solid First Grade attack with off spinner Kev Duffy. He took 133 wickets over 5 seasons at 19.2, his best season being 1955–6 with 40 wickets. As a lower order batsman, he scored 536 runs at 11.9, with a highest score of 79. Trevor took a commerce degree from Queensland University, and later worked for the Mineral Sands Companies on the Gold Coast.



UQCC Foundation Trust

UQCC India tour 2024



Day 1: 29 March

Late in the evening of 30 March 2024, UQCCs touring party of 21 members arrived in Delhi where an unforgettable journey would commence. On arrival at the Eros Hotel, we received a traditional Indian welcome with a tilak (red dot) on our foreheads. We went on to enjoy our first Indian meal, a buffet at the hotel, which included 10+ different types of curry, roti, naan and biryani, and headed to bed shortly after.

Day 2: 30 March

Today we were up early in tourist mode as we were headed to the city of Agra (around 3 hours south of Delhi) to see the Taj Mahal. We got in a quick traditional breakfast from the hotel, which again included several different types of curry, roti, naan, yoghurt and sweets, among other items.

On arrival at the Taj Mahal, we were met by our tour guide Vikram Singh, a true character and passionate guide of the Taj Mahal for tourists. The Taj Mahal attracts between 30,000 and 40,000 visitors on average per day, so it was packed with eager tourists everywhere. Vikram explained the history and significance of the Taj Mahal – it represents a memorial where Shah Jahan, the Mughal emperor of India who reigned from 1628–58, and his favourite wife Mumtaz Mahal are buried. Additionally, Vikram

explained how the site became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983 and explained that the Taj Mahal has maintained its beauty and structural integrity due to the quality of Indian marble.

After enjoying this breathtaking experience, we travelled to a nearby hotel for a buffet lunch – buffet being the key word. The food did not stop coming for about 2 hours. Mixed in with a few Kingfishers and exhaustion from our international flight the previous day, it's safe to say that the entire touring party was exhausted. Consequently, we departed Agra shortly after lunch and embarked on our 3-hour bus ride home. That night we enjoyed a simple dinner at the hotel and a few beers at the Irish pub down the street, where we watched the IPL. It was lights out early that evening prior to our first match the next day.

Day 3: 31 March

That morning we woke up with a spring in our step, ready for our first match of the tour against the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi team. IIT Delhi has the reputation as the most prestigious university in India, offering courses only in science, engineering and technology. The current CEO of Google, Sundar Pichai, attended IIT Delhi from 1971 to 1976.

The match was scheduled to be a 50-over one-day game, but was later rescheduled to 2 T20 matches.

Match 1 – UQ 3/120 (16.3) def IIT Delhi 10/119 (20) – Callum Henderson 2/5 (2), Mayank Ahalani 2/8 (2), Max Clayton 41* (18) and Tom Kelaart 39* (35).

Match 2 – UQ 7/152 (20) def IIT Delhi 10/140 (19) – James Grady 90* (58) and Tirth Shah 2/25 (4).

Straight after the game we headed back to our hotel for a quick shower before heading back out to St Stephens College, where we were invited to have dinner. St Stephens College is a prestigious private institution in Delhi, and was our opponent in a T20 match the following day. We were treated to a tour of the campus grounds, insightful speeches from staff at the college, including the captain of their cricket team, and a generous traditional dinner.

While the meal and company of the St Stephens students and staff were excellent, there was a strong sense of competition in the air ahead of the match the following day.

Day 4: 1 April

Gameday. With two wins on the board and some real intent shown by the St Stephens team at dinner the previous evening, the UQCC team was fired up and ready for the match. We were delighted to be able to play the match at a Ranji Trophy ground among noisy, bustling streets – this was a truly authentic experience.

The match got off to the perfect start for St Stephens, who were sent into bowl and took a wicket on their first ball. The tension was high. Fortunately for UQCC, captain James Grady entered the crease, and he and Max Clayton put on a match-winning 140 run partnership.

St Stephens College got off to a reasonable and seemed to enjoy the battle of taking on some

Australian pacers. Unfortunately for St Stephens, and surprising to UQCC, it was the spin offered by UQCC, delivered through Mayank Ahalani, that was their undoing. Mayank took 4 wickets and the power out of St Stephens batting. Overall, St Stephens managed a final score of 136 and UQCC was now 3 from 3.

Match summary – UQ 6/198 (20) def St Stephens College 8/136 (20) – James Grady 78 (39), Max Clayton 64 (47) and Mayank Ahalani 4/19 (4).

Following the game, representatives from Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade joined the post-match ceremony, marking the significance of the relationships formed between the two parties. Players for UQCC and St Stephens traded jerseys at the end of the match, further solidifying those relationships.

Next, UQCC was due to head for a tour of an Islamic slum, but due to the nature of the busy streets, the bus that was transporting the team was delayed. On the bus driver's arrival, a parking ticket inspector was physically hanging off the side window of the bus, seeking to fine the bus driver. After a 20-minute disagreement between the parties, eventually we were able to get back on the bus, feeling rather frazzled. This was a unique and authentic experience.

The party finally arrived at the Islamic slum and was welcomed by volunteers of Asha Charity. Meaning 'hope' in Hindi, Asha has been helping the slum dwellers of Delhi since 1988, when Dr Kiran Martin started treating cholera victims who were too poor or culturally constrained to seek help elsewhere. Day 5: 2 April

Despite these disappointments, there were also moments of promise and individual brilliance. George Thomas, Abhimanyu Chutani, Bailey Gould, Seb Sinnott, Cameron Dubbleman and Tom Kiley were all crucial players, not only in terms of being able to field a side, but also in continuing to offer competitive gameplay.

In conclusion, while this season may have been underwhelming, it has also been a crucial learning experience. We faced challenges and setbacks, but we have also gained insights into areas of improvement.

Again I must thank Chris Forrester especially for his continued support throughout the season.

While premiership success has remained elusive, the experience and the camaraderie has been enjoyable to say the least. They were also ably supported by our spinners Shushant, 'Wriggles' and Mayank, and a fat, old, slow-medium bowler who offered advice (yours truly). TK's enthusiasm in everything he did for the team was another highlight. Late in the season, young fast bowling prospect Brock Balcombe joined the team and showed his prodigious talent. He was quickly promoted to 5s and but for a washout in the GF, would have in all likelihood bowled UQ to victory. Once again, I'd like to thank the players for their support and their wholehearted efforts during the season. Thanks also to my fellow UQCC captains, especially for the interest shown and the encouragement you gave myself and the team.

Lord's Taverners report

At UQ, the aim for the Lord's Taverners program is to transition the boys into senior men's cricket. With the evolving strength of the junior program at UQ, this enables a clear pathway for our boys from the junior program to the senior program and for the players to experience what a club like UQ has to offer.

The season started with the usual expectations session for both parents and students to give clarity to all involved about how we wanted to approach the season. This involved the boys learning more about one another and coming together to create a shared vision for the year. Furthermore, this was aimed at challenging the boys to think like 'young men', and that from this day onwards, they would be in charge of all communication and time management throughout the season.

The season started with two fantastic wins against Darling Downs and Wide Bay. In both games, scores of 250+ were put on the board batting first, which gave the team a fantastic foundation moving forward. These two wins set the tone for the season and proved to the boys that if they backed themselves and looked to put pressure on the opposition constantly with bat, ball and in the field, that they would have a successful season. The next game against Wests again proved to the UQ Tavs side that they were capable of pushing their ceiling as high as they wanted to. Wests have been a benchmark program over the past few years, so for UQ to put on a score of 251 and defend it was no mean feat. Along with the positive running between the wickets, calculated risks, and constant rotation of the strike from the batting group, our bowlers were creating some fantastic partnerships. Both Harry Langdon and Will Parkinson had freedom to bowl with pace alongside the fantastic work of our spinners, who were able to consistently go at under 4 an over during the first 20 overs. This was also backed up by the likes of Christian Alexander, Dan Boreham and Angus Storen, who were relentless with their line and length and finished off our bowling innings throughout the season, restricting our opposition from hitting boundaries and stunting their momentum. The most pleasing factor of the season was how the boys bounced back from the two losses that they had. During these two games, the boys acknowledged that they did not continue to play the game that we wanted to play when put under pressure. The fact that the team were able to

acknowledge this, put this in the back of their mind and focus on the next game showed maturity from all involved. One of the 'bounce-back' games was in the semi-final against Sandgate-Redcliffe, who had a fantastic season. The boys stuck to their brand of cricket and built positive partnerships around the skipper, Zac Olsen, who saw UQ get over the line with a 94* chasing 219. The Grand Final saw the boys travel to the Gold Coast to play against an outfit that looked to play a similar brand of the game. Any chance of a Gold Coast flying start was halted by Harry Langdon and Jem Du, with their top three all making 0. Throughout their batting innings, moments of brilliance in the field and relentless pressure with the ball meant that the Gold Coast could never hit their straps, despite some decent partnerships through the middle. This gave UQ 164 as a target to win their second Lord's Taverners competition. As he did in many of his games, Blake Armstrong took the attack to Gold Coast, scoring 43 off 40 at the top of the innings. Our middle order were then tasked with doing what they had all season, which they did. Alex Walduck, Zak Olsen and Theo Bacalakis kept ticking the scoreboard along to steer the boys to victory, 6 wickets down.

While winning the tournament was a very pleasing factor, it was the attitude shown, the buy-in to a game plan and emphasis on building a strong team culture that I was most impressed with throughout the year. The squad should be very proud of themselves, with all 15 members being instrumental in the success, whether that was on or off the field.

I look forward to watching the boys progress, whether that is in a second season of Tavs or in the grade arena.

Juniors report

UQCC maintained its numbers in the boys junior competition, but did not have any standalone UQCC teams in the girls competitions. Numbers in the MSW post-Christmas season were limited to 5 teams, but there was strong interest in the BMC T20 competition with 4 teams.

It is evident that UQCC's key junior market is 12 years and over, with the quality of players in this category continuing to set the benchmark for the zone.

Queensland Cricket introduced the inaugural Brisbane Metropolitan Cricket competition. The club entered a team based on more cricket for its plate players. Other premier clubs used this competition as a pathway to Tavs and UQCC will position itself accordingly for the 2024–25 season.

The winter program was the most successful from a participation perspective, with the club fielding 9 teams across U12, 13, 14, 15 and seniors. There

has been an increase in players wanting to play cricket during winter from both UQCC players and other clubs.

The values of having fun, participation, accountability and trying to develop players to achieve their potential are core to UQCC. The UQ Way was developed as a mechanism to ingrain this in the junior program. Feedback has been positive, and this will be further developed to enhance the UQCC playing experience next season.

These are exciting times for UQCC and developing the UQ Way and facilities will enhance the UQ junior experience moving forward.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 June 2024

The financial statements cover University of Queensland Cricket Club as an individual entity. University of Queensland Cricket Club is a not-for-profit University of Queensland Cricket Club incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020)* ('the Act').

Principal activities

The principal activities of the University of Queensland Cricket Club for the year ended 30 June 2024 were to foster, promote, increase participation rates and develop the game of cricket within the University of Queensland and surrounding precincts.

The functional and presentation currency of University of Queensland Cricket Club is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee the University of Queensland Cricket Club is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. Accordingly, these special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Association Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected financial assets and financial liabilities.

Material accounting policy information relating to the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Specific revenue streams

The revenue recognition policies for the principal revenue streams of the University of Queensland Cricket Club are:

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the Association obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

(a) Revenue and other income

Specific revenue streams

When grant revenue is received whereby the Association incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered as a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

When the Association receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Canteen Income

Income generated from the sale of food and beverages through the canteen is recorded as canteen revenue. All sales are recognized when the goods are delivered, and revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Merchandise revenue

Revenue from the sale of merchandise is recognized at the point of sale. The value of merchandise revenue is determined based on the sale price less any applicable discounts or returns. Cost of goods sold related to merchandise is recorded to reflect the expenses incurred in acquiring the merchandise

Function income

Income from functions, including events and activities organized by the association, is recognized when the event takes place. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable

Registration and membership fees

Revenue from registration and membership fees are recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

Coaching income

Income from coaching services is recognized as the coaching sessions are delivered. Income is recorded at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Coaching income includes fees for individual or group coaching sessions occurred in the financial year.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated, then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Specific revenue streams

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

Statement of financial position balances relating to revenue recognition

Contract assets and liabilities

Where the amounts billed to customers are based on the achievement of various milestones established in the contract, the amounts recognised as revenue in a given period do not necessarily coincide with the amounts billed to or certified by the customer.

When a performance obligation is satisfied by transferring a promised good or service to the customer before the customer pays consideration or the before payment is due, the University of Queensland Cricket Club presents the contract as a contract asset, unless the University of Queensland Cricket Club's rights to that amount of consideration are unconditional, in which case the University of Queensland Cricket Club recognises a receivable.

When an amount of consideration is received from a customer prior to the entity transferring a good or service to the customer, the University of Queensland Cricket Club presents the contract as a contract liability.

Contract cost assets

The University of Queensland Cricket Club recognises assets relating to the costs of obtaining a contract and the costs incurred to fulfil a contract or set up / mobilisation costs that are directly related to the contract provided they will be recovered through performance of the contract.

Costs to obtain a contract

Costs to obtain a contract are only capitalised when they are directly related to a contract, and it is probable that they will be recovered in the future. Costs incurred that would have been incurred regardless of whether the contract was won are expensed, unless those costs are explicitly chargeable to the customer in any case (whether or not the contract is won).

Set-up / mobilisation costs

Costs required to set up the contract, including mobilisation costs, are capitalised provided that it is probable that they will be recovered in the future and that they do not include expenses that would normally have been incurred by the University of Queensland Cricket Club if the contract had not been obtained. They are recognised as an expense on the basis of the proportion of actual output to estimated output under each contract. If the above conditions are not met, these costs are taken directly to profit or loss as incurred.

Costs to fulfil a contract

Where costs are incurred to fulfil a contract, they are accounted for under the relevant accounting standard (if appropriate), otherwise if the costs relate directly to a contract, the costs generate or enhance resources of the University of Queensland Cricket Club that will be used to satisfy performance obligations in the future and the

costs are expected to be recovered then they are capitalised as contract costs assets.

These costs are released to the profit or loss on a systematic basis consistent with the transfer to the customer of the goods or services to which the asset relates which is expected to be between - and - years.

(b) Income tax

The University of Queensland Cricket Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the standard costs basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

(e) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs, except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred.

On initial recognition, the University of Queensland Cricket Club classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the University of Queensland Cricket Club changes its business model for managing financial assets.

Amortised cost

The University of Queensland Cricket Club's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and

other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of assets and liabilities.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment.

Interest income and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities

The University of Queensland Cricket Club measures all financial liabilities initially at fair value less transaction costs, subsequently financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

The financial liabilities of the University of Queensland Cricket Club comprise trade and other payables and provisions.

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(g) Economic dependence

University of Queensland Cricket Club is dependent on the grants from community for the majority of its revenue used to operate the business. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the grants from community will not continue to support University of Queensland Cricket Club.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Committee members make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - grant income

For many of the grant agreements received, the determination of whether the contract includes sufficiently specific performance obligations was a significant judgement involving discussions with a number of parties at the University of Queensland Cricket Club, review of the proposal documents prepared during the grant application phase and consideration of the terms and conditions.

Grants received by the University of Queensland Cricket Club have been accounted for under both AASB 15 and AASB 1058 depending on the terms and conditions and decisions made.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of University of Queensland Cricket Club (the Association), which comprises the statement of assets and liabilities as at 30 June 2024, the statement of profit or loss, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including material accounting policy information, and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report of the Association for the year ended 30 June 2024 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Opening Balances

The previous financial report was not audited by us. We were unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means concerning a number of opening balances disclosed in the statements of financial performance, statement of cash flows and the statement of financial position, as comparative figures. Whilst we were satisfied with the material accuracy of amounts recorded in the statement of financial position at 30 June 2024, the impact of opening balances on the current period financial performance and cash flows prevents us from forming an opinion on the financial report taken as a whole.

Revenue

Canteen Revenue is mainly cash transactions. The Association has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of this cash transactions prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding these revenue sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to these transactions had to be restricted to those amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether the revenue transactions recorded in the income statement by the Association are complete.

Inventory

The Association recorded inventory balance of \$40,392 (2023: \$31,163) at year ended 30 June 2024. The stock take was performed by the client on 30 June 2024. Given the fact that we did not attend the stock count physically, we could not provide opinion on the existence and accuracy of the inventory items.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards)* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for the Association and should not be distributed to or used by parties other than the Association. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981., and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion.
